## WHO WE ARE

Mara Training Centre (MTC) is located in the world-famous Maasai Mara ecosystem in Kenya. The overall purpose of the program is to enhance the capacity of participants and their wider communities to create and manage the future they desire.

It does this by focusing on 3 main aspects: building inclusive social participation, governance and decisionmaking; creating locally-led-and-implemented regenerative planned grazing; and stimulating growth in both livestock and wildlife-based enterprises through value-chain development.

MTC is linked to 2 other "working labs" in the Mara which together form a unique learning hub: Enonkishu Conservancy, a community-owned wildlife and livestock conservancy (www.enonkishu.com); and Mara Beef, who are pioneering sustainable livestock value chains that give greater returns and reliable markets for communities (www.marabeef.com). Together, these provide a rich and practical learning environment that blends best-practice principles with emerging developments. The learning hub also represents a strong resource for the region.

The hub is also a certified member of the Savory Institute global learning hubs network, the first in Eastern Africa (www.savory.com). In addition to our normal training short courses, we offer globally-recognised trainer and practitioner certification programs that utilise trainees' work environments, so as to maximise value and minimise absence from work.

# CERTIFIED TRAINER & PRACTITIONER PROGRAMS

At MTC we have a team of certified trainers and experienced practitioners who facilitate our certified programs:


**Livestock & Grazing Managers Certification:** for those who want to master livestock and grazing management, particularly with communities, and including ability to train others.

**Professional Herders Certification:** skills and knowledge for constructing seasonal grazing plans, maximising forage use and animal weight gain, low-stress herd handling, livestock condition assessment & animal husbandry.

**Trainer of Trainers Certification:** for those who want to become Master Trainers across all aspects of community, land and livestock management.

**Village-Based Trainers Certification:** eco-literacy and basic land management concepts for either literate or illiterate audiences disseminated by community members at village level (planned to commence in 2019).

**School teachers eco-literacy program:** materials, programs and coaching for supplementary environmental management for schools (planned to commence in 2019).



# Courses







Grazing & Livestock Manager Certification (April – December 2018). Cost USD 3500.

Trainer-of-Trainer Certification in Holistic Management (April 2018 – March 2019). Cost USD 6500.

Herder Certification (3 month course x 3 intakes May, August, November). Cost USD 500.

Note: learners will be required to develop a learning contract and to practice between intensives in their home learning community

## Grazing & Livestock Manager Certification course outline

**April - Intensive 1:** 5 day regenerative grazing management & biological monitoring – principles and practice.

**June - Intensive 2:** 5 day regenerative grazing management & biological monitoring – training and facilitating others.

**August – Intensive 3:** 2 days animal husbandry and herd management including market availability, access, costs and benefits + 3 days building community support, organisation and action for improved animal & grazing practice.

**October - Intensive 4:** 5-day on-site mentoring & performance evaluation. **December - Intensive 5:** 5-day on-site mentoring & performance evaluation.

## Trainer-of-Trainer (Master Trainer) Certification course outline

**April - Intensive 1:** 5-day regenerative grazing management & biological monitoring – principles and practice.

**May - Intensive 2:** 5-day livestock husbandry and herd management including market availability, access, costs and benefits.

**June - Intensive 3:** 5-day regenerative grazing management & biological monitoring – training and facilitating others.

**August - Intensive 4:** 6-day building community assessment, purpose, organisation and action planning for change management practice.

October - Intensive 5: 5-day on-site mentoring & performance evaluation. December - Intensive 6: 5-day fundamentals of financial management. January - Intensive 7: 5-day management of livestock & wildlife interaction & sustainable tourism development and wildlife.

March - Intensive 8: 5-day on-site mentoring & performance evaluation.

Module 1: 3-day training at MTC leaning site in eco-literacy, regenerative grazing management, herd management, basic husbandry, land health monitoring, low-stress handling
Module 2: 2-day supervised home-site practice & evaluation
Module 3: 2-day review & Module 1 refresher session
Module 4: 2-day supervised home-site practice & final evaluation

Intake Dates: May, August, November Length: 3 months

## Village-Based Trainers Certification course outline (planned for 2019)

**3-day Intensive:** materials and training for eco-literacy (reading the land), the function and value of biodiversity, and fundamentals for community-based restoration of land and water health and productivity; for literate and illiterate village audiences.

**3-day Intensive:** materials and training for eco-literacy (reading the land), the function and value of biodiversity, and fundamentals for community-based restoration of land and water health and productivity.

### **On-going practice with learning communities**

- All trainees as part of their certification develop a learning contract with their 'learning community' they live in or work with
- The lessons of each intensives are implemented, practiced and assessed together with one's learning community
- These form part of the certification process

### **On-site mentoring & performance assessment**

- Trainers will spend one-on-one time with each trainee at the trainee's 'learning community' site verifying interaction and progress
- Mentoring of trainees on-the-job as appropriate
- Facilitating future work plans for trainees with communities
